Why we defend our faith

Last Sunday, we talked about why we should defend our faith. As we progress through High school, College, and even beyond, we will encounter many others who hate, misunderstand, or mischaracterize, Christians. Some purposefully but most simply from ignorance of the Christian faith. We looked at why it's important for us to know why we believe what we do and why we should defend our faith from the many misconceptions in the world.

As Christians, we are called to more than just believe in Jesus and sit in Church on Sundays. Jesus calls us to lead others to God's Saving Grace. We looked at 1

Peter 3:15 to see that we should always be prepared to give answers about our faith to everyone who asks.

We said, that's fine but what if they're not asking? What's wrong with just letting others believe and say whatever they like about Christians? We know what we believe and we know we're saved. What's wrong with just ignoring what others say about Christians?

We then looked at a long list of some example



15 But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,

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misconceptions and false statements commonly made about Christians and Christianity.

We said that some of these come from simple misinterpretations or taking scripture out of context. But, many more come from witnessing the actual behavior and actions of the very people who call themselves Christians.

The problem is that as Christians, we are set apart from the world but when these false statements are repeated long enough, people start to believe that they're true. Then they begin to believe that Christians are no different (or are worse) than anyone else in the world so why should they listen to you or even bother believing in Jesus? In order to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19-20) we need to let others know the truth.

But, arguing with them, fighting with them, threatening them, or yelling at them from street corners (or on social media) is definitely not the way to do it. Like 1 Peter 3:15 says, we should always do it "with gentleness and respect."

Engaging with non-believers requires patience, love, and understanding. We can't expect non-Christians to think like or act like Christians because they're not. We also can't expect them to understand things like Grace, or Mercy, or Salvation, etc. so we need to speak in simple terms that everyone understands at whatever level they are currently at.

When speaking with non-Christians about your faith, it's not about telling them that their way is wrong but by showing them how your way is the true way and how it positively affects your life today.

Always be yourself and speak from your heart asking the Holy Spirit for guidance on the right words to say or the right actions to take.

Don't expect to change anyone's belief, that's not your job. Your job is only to plant the seeds that can lead others to Jesus through the power of God.

We then went through a few possible scenarios of defending our faith with sample responses, planting seeds in love and with respect.

Many of the misconceptions against Christians come from others seeing "Christians" actual behavior.

Remember: We represent God on Earth. We
